STAAR 100-Point Scale O verview

The State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR®) 100-Point Scale allows for the comparison of a student's performance with the performances of other students who took the same STAAR End-of-Course (EOC) assessment. The 100-Point Scale is defined using percentiles, which represent the percentage of students across the state who took the assessment and received a scale score less than the scale score of interest. Percentiles are calculated based on all students, except for out-of-school testers, who received valid scale scores on the assessment during the spring administration of that year.

For example, a student who earned a scale score of 42 on the STAAR U.S. History.044 Tw (on)Tj 0 Tc -0.02c4

What if my student's scale score does not appear in the 100-Point Scale Table? (DFK administration may result in different specific scale scores. The specificscale scores listed in the 100-Point Scale Tableare the ones from the spring administration. If your student's scale score is not listed in thetable, a range for the percentile can be obtained. The percentile associated with yourstudent's scale score is between the percentiles for the scale scores in the table just above
